Gain experience on our expanding Trapp Farm as we grow produce for our first season of production! Grow high-quality, nutrient-dense food while stewarding the land and adding to your farming skills. You will work with our farm manager, farm fellow, operations director, volunteers and other workers while doing a wide variety of farm tasks.

Responsibilities include:

- Fieldwork (soil prep, planting, cultivation, harvest)
- Processing (washing, packing, delivery)
- Animal care (observation, paddock moves, feeding, loading)
- Farm maintenance, cleaning, and organizing
- Farm infrastructure projects
- All work will be outside or in a hoop house
- Drop off produce at grocery stores

Qualifications:

- 21 years of age or older at the time of employment
- Ability to commit a minimum of 8 hours a week (could be done over multiple shifts) for a minimum of 4 weeks
- Self-Motivated
- Some experience in small scale intensive organic vegetable farming is a plus
- Ability to do physical work under varying weather conditions
- Ability to work as a part of a team
- Attention to detail and pride in a job well done
- Good communication skills
- Positive Attitude
- Ability to lift 25+ lbs.
