LETTER FROM THE **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**

Dear Friends,

Osprey Wilds is a special place. Each year, as more threats arise towards the environment and our planet, the beauty and wonder that can be seen, felt and experienced at Osprey Wilds becomes clearer and more cherished. We live in a world where the average child spends 60 times more minutes on a screen than outside on a typical day. Even in Minnesota, it isn't a given that children can or will spend time outdoors. Osprey Wilds provides such an opportunity for children and young people – a nature escape, a learning laboratory, a touch point to the outdoors – as well as giving adults a place to rekindle and deepen their bond with the natural world.

During fiscal year 2022-23, we saw that play out daily as we continued to come back from COVID-19, growing program and attendance numbers and reaching more people than any of the previous three years. While that progress is promising, we still have not gotten back to a comfortable place financially as we struggle with higher expenses and depressed revenues compared to pre-pandemic levels. We are making program adjustments, not only in offerings, but also in fee structures, and at the same time, securing and awarding more scholarships than ever before to make our programs as affordable and accessible as possible. Thanks to the generous support of donors, we exceeded our fundraising goals last year, not only in general contributions, but also in our 6th annual Bids for Kids fundraiser. Those charitable contributions are essential for our organization – as we navigate the waters of increasing expenses and gaps in the programming schedule.

This fiscal year, we began a tremendously exciting endeavor, partnering with Minnesota's other outdoor schools (residential environmental learning centers), to introduce legislation to make it possible for every Minnesota student to have a multi-day, overnight learning experience at an accredited outdoor school. With strong bi-partisan support and both Democratic and Republican introduced bills, there is widespread excitement and passion to get this bill passed and funded. We will continue working hard this winter and spring to reach our goal of Outdoor School For All becoming a reality for every Minnesota k-12 student. Stay tuned as we work on this historic legislation, and in the meantime, please enjoy the following pages to see how your support made a difference in thousands of lives through Osprey Wilds last fiscal year.

Equity – We actively incorporate the lenses of equity and representation in our education, environmentalism, and leadership.


Action – We practice and encourage informed, intentional living that helps restore and maintain healthy ecosystems.

Osprey Wilds actively incorporates the lenses of equity and representation in our education, environmentalism and leadership. We do this by dismantling and re-designing processes and systems to be accessible to and welcoming of all people; creating programs and services in collaboration with diverse communities; and valuing those who work with and for us.



LAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Osprey Wilds acknowledges that our property sits upon the ancestral and traditional homelands of Indigenous people, most recently the Ojibwe, whose land was seized by the United States government by the Treaty of 1837 and colonized by European settlers. The Ojibwe continue to reside throughout East Central Minnesota and have a sovereign infrastructure of schools, roads, health care, services, housing, and more. From their ancestors to current day, the Ojibwe are committed to protecting and preserving natural resources. Osprey Wilds shares this commitment and works to ensure responsible care and attention through developing an understanding, ethics, and responsibility regarding the environment through formal and informal teaching that links nature and humans. While land acknowledgment does not deliver justice for the loss of the land and the damage done to people and cultures, Osprey Wilds will continue to deepen our knowledge and relationships, enriching practices that respect and honor the past, present, and future of the region's Indigenous communities.

PROGRAMS

Our 2022-23 school year continued to rebound slowly from the impacts of COVID19. While the number of schools attending got significantly closer to our pre-covid numbers, the total number of participants did not increase at the same pace. We conducted post-program surveys to see what types of barriers students are facing that may be preventing them from coming on their school's field trip to Osprey Wilds. The most common reason is parent's reluctance to send their child away from home. This high level of reluctance does not match pre-COVID attitudes towards overnight field trips. We are promoting our K-12 video and the opportunity to have the Education Director meet with parents and students via zoom to answer questions and share about the space.

OUR DONORS

The numbers were impressive once again in fiscal 2022-23: 365 donors made more than 800 gifts totaling more than \$380,000. That generosity helped us provide powerful connections to nature for more than 3,000 children, young people, and adults; it met special needs for campus maintenance and improvements; and it bolstered Osprey Wild's financial strength for the future.

Giving for program support totaled \$212,000, exceeding the budgeted \$200,000 by 6 percent. Your generosity helped more than 2,000 children and young people have hands-on encounters with nature through our K-12 programs, summer camps, and wildlife outreach activities. Your support also touched thousands more involved in our family camps, community events, college courses, adult weekends, Road Scholar programs, and charter schools.

The annual Bids for Kids fundraiser again surpassed expectations, raising almost \$3,000 more than the budgeted \$40,000. As the name suggests, these funds helped provide scholarships and keep costs down for participants in our youth programs.

The \$16,700 given for special projects had more visible results than in some years. Most notably, gleaming hardwood floors on the main level of Schwyzer Lodge replaced badly worn carpet and linoleum and helped make this National Register of Historic Places treasure more historically authentic. Designated gifts also helped with the acquisition of a baby American porcupine, Quillbert, successor to the beloved Spike.

Finally, early in the fiscal year we received the second distribution, more than \$106,000, from the estate of Jill Mithun. An example of foresight and generosity, her total bequest added more than \$186,000 to our endowment fund, where it will grow to help meet future needs while also providing annual income for operations and special projects.

Thank you for being part of a community that believes in and supports environmental learning. Your partnership is foundational to our continued success in helping thousands of children, young people, and adults of all ages make meaningful connections with the natural world and grow in their commitment to its preservation. You are making a very real difference!


